Key Vocabulary

3D textile	A 3D shape made from two identical fabric shapes.
Design	To plan, draw and write simple labels for what we are going to make.
Evaluate	To say what is good and what we could make better in our products.
Join	To combine two pieces of fabric.
Measure	To check or make sure something is the correct size.
Back stitch	Stitches are made backward to the general direction of sewing.
Over stitch	To sew with stitches passing over an edge, especially closely, so as to cover the edge or make a firm seam
Running stitch	A line of small even stitches which run back and forth through fabric without overlapping.
