Key Vocabulary	Definition
Rural	Areas in the country which are less densely populated, often located in the countryside.
Urban	Areas that are built-up, such as a town or city. Areas of the country which are more densely populated.
Ordnance Survey Map (OS map)	Ordnance Survey is Great Britain's national mapping agency. It carries out the official surveying of Britain.
Landmarks	A building or monument of historical importance.
Attractions	A place which draws visitors by providing something of interest or pleasure.
Local	Relating to a small area, especially of a country. Example: your local area = your nearby area.
Locate	Discover the exact place or position of something.
