

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Aerial photograph	A photograph that is taken from the air, usually from an airplane.
United Kingdom	It is a country which is made up of four parts: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
Town	A town is a place where people live. Smaller than a city and there is not a lot of people in a town.
Land	The part of the Earth's surface that is not covered by water.
Map	A map is something that show us the local area and can help us find our way around an area.
Atlas	A book containing maps.
Symbol key	This is a part of a map that tells us what is on the map. A symbol will link to a key feature on the map.
Location	A specific point or area on Earth's surface.
Questionnaire	A list of questions that someone asks to learn more about what people think or feel.




