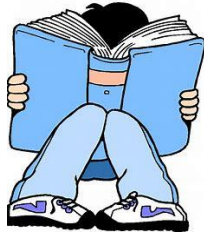

Active

verb where the subject does the action

Passive

verb where the subject of the sentence has the action done to it
- The teddy bear was hugged by the boy. The bear receives the action.
