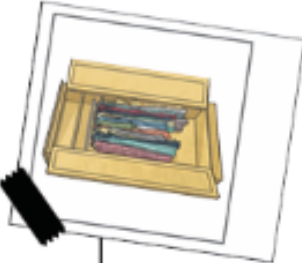
Test One

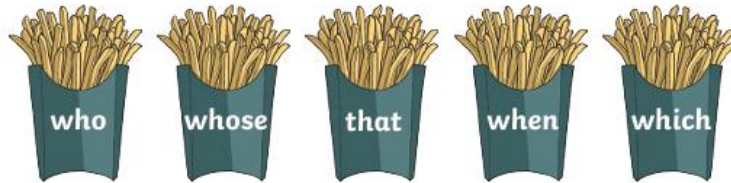
