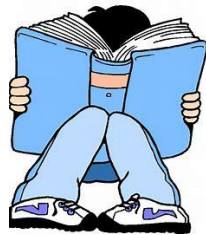

Hypnosis Hour

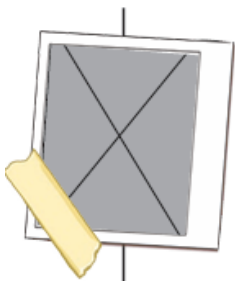
"Do we have any volunteers?"
